We recognize nature as an incredible teacher, classroom, and playground waiting to be explored and deserving of the utmost respect. However, it is important to recognize that no one can control nature, and we may find ourselves in situations where we are wet, hot, cold or uncomfortable. We embrace these situations as learning opportunities and will navigate them as safely as possible in our supportive and knowledgeable community. At Forest Wild we believe that the best learning takes place when we push the limits of our "comfort zone." This means that we sometimes intentionally design experiences that place our participants in situations where they need to push themselves - and each other - in safe, supportive ways to successfully grasp the full lesson of the learning opportunity.

We uphold our mission: to encourage curiosity and exploration in an all-outdoors environment with supported risk-taking and emphasis on life skills. In order to effectively enact our mission and provide high quality educational experiences for every participant, we all must agree on certain guidelines:

- We must respect each other, our personal gear and our space. We are here to support each other and to grow, so act accordingly. Treat each other, living things, and the land with care. Listen to our staff and follow their directions; most of what they say is for your education, comfort and safety.
